ABOUT THE EVENT /

The annual <u>Association of North American Graduate Programs in Conservation (ANAGPIC)</u> student conference will take place on April 20 - 22, 2017 and is hosted by the Conservation Center of the Institute of Fine Arts, NYU and the Historic Preservation Program at the Graduate School of Architecture Planning & Preservation, Columbia University.

For over forty years, ANAGPIC has held an annual conference featuring student presentations over the course of three days. Each meeting is hosted in turn by one ANAGPIC member program. Typically, each school is represented by two students, selected by faculty of their respective program, who present a recent conservation treatment or the results of a technical investigation. This year, the sessions will take place at the Institute of Fine Arts, the Morgan Library & Museum, and Columbia University. We anticipate about 200 students, faculty and staff in art conservation and historic preservation programs from across the United States and Canada to attend.


